Rosary college clarifies on viral video

Says motive of uploading video was to tarnish image of institution; fines imposed on late comers to instil discipline and punctuality among students

MARGAO: Clarifying on the video that went viral on social media of a security guard allegedly taking money from students for coming late, the Management of Our Lady of Rosary College has stated that this exercise was only initiated to instil discipline and punctuality among the student community.

The College management has also said that video was deliberately uploaded on social media to tarnish the

image of the institution.

In the last few days, a video of the college security guard collecting Rs 50 at the gate in order to allow entry to late comers went viral on social media.

Responding to the issue, Fr Gabriel Coutinho, Administrator of the College told O Herald that it was really painful to see the image of the college getting tarnished.

"We initiated the exercise only to instil discipline among students. After observing that most

students often came late to college, we imposed a fine on them so that they would fall in line. Their parents too were informed about the issue during the orientation day programme and only then it was implemented," said Fr Coutinho.

Principal Prof Helic Barreto said that till the end of June, they tolerated late comers but fines were imposed lately.

"The money collected from the students was deposited in the college

by the security and used to issue receipts. Our plan was to refund the money later. This exercise has resulted in most students coming on time and had dwindled the number of late comers," Barreto informed.

The Principal also stated that the only purpose of the exercise was to see that students should not miss classes as they have to maintain 75 per cent of attendance, according to Goa University rules.

Tiatr 'Sankov' scripted by Fr Roman Rodrigues and directed by Gautam Gawde speaks about different relationships that exist within and outside the family. And the ties that grow through brother-sister relationship, friendship, ultimately culminating into deep love.

The curtains unfold to a scene at a culvert where there's a young couple seated on one side, the girl is a Catholic and the boy is a Hindu. On the other extreme end, there's a group of youth involved in talks, drinking and smoking. There's another couple who frequents the place as well. An unknown character is seen in the centre serving as a mediator and provides a piece of advice to the confused couple and also tries to resolve a tussle among the youth. "Digital education and training in technology for education is very essential for our faculty to adapt and be active in using technological tools in classrooms. The implementation of NEP 2020 in classrooms is impossible without technology," said secretary (education) Prasad Loylayekar.

The directorate of higher education (DHE) and the Goa State Higher Education Council (GSHEC), in collabo-

ration with SWAYAM national coordinator Consortium for Educational Communication, New Delhi, organised the two-day training programme.

There is a need for more good quality MOOCs in all disciplines and faculty must be trained

for this purpose," said additional director of the Consortium for Educational Communication, professor Rajnish Shrivastava.

Kavita Asnani, MOOC nodal officer at DHE, said that the directorate, under its programme 'MANDAVI' (Mentoring and Nurturing Digital and Virtual Initiatives), had signed MoU with CEC in September 2022. "As part of this MoU, DHE handed over two full-fledged MOOCs to CEC," she said.

During the workshop, intensive hands-on sessions were conducted by resource experts from IIT, NIT and the industry for faculty members from Goa. The participants were trained in tools like VLab and generative AI during the workshop and they were motivated to develop MOOCs in their respective disciplines.

stage events will include ward-wise millet dish cooking competition and interactive lectures by Krishi Vigyan Kendra. There will be stalls by self-help groups and an exhibition on millets by Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Directorate of Agriculture.

"The aim of the Navelim Millets Festival 2023 is to unite the village and so we have organised ward-wise competitions. The theme of the festival is 'Millets: An ancient grain for modern health'. Once the festival was announced, there has been so much enthusiasm among the villagers. People who used to cultivate together are now planning to cook together for the competition and it is a community event. We have been so lost and separated by greed, jealousy and religion that it is important for us to come together," says Priya.

As part of the mandate of the Navelim Biodiversity Management Committee, they have the responsibility to conserve biodiversity through the species of plants, trees, animals and birds. "We have to create a register of all the biodiversity that is found in the village. In the same way, we also have to create a register of traditional healers and tap into the knowledge of these people who use locally found plants, trees and roots to create medicines for various ailments.

They should be encouraged to share their knowledge at least with their family members. Once they pass away that knowledge is lost forever," adds Priya.

On Sunday, a zonal agricultural officer will be presenting a talk to the Navelim villagers about millets and motivate them to get back to cultivating millets. "We have lost the touch of farming and are more focused on paddy cultivation. The talk will motivate and mobilise the villagers to look at millet cultivation from a new perspective and will help start a millet cultivation," concludes Priya optimistically.
